Hi All,

Hope everyone is having a wonderful summer. We have been covering the book of Acts over the last few Sundays and I wanted to encourage everyone to take a little time and read the book of Acts. It is the only source we have of the very early Church. It covers the time period from just after the Ascension of Jesus to the imprisonment of Paul in Rome. Jesus ascended to heaven to the right hand of the Father about A.D. 30, give or take a few years, and Paul was imprisoned in Rome about A.D. 62. Accordingly, Acts covers roughly the first 30 years of Christianity. It is directed to Gentiles with a basic purpose of sharing the truthful and triumphant spreading of the Gospel of Jesus. The key verse of Acts is verse 1:8 Jesus tells His closest followers, will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall in Jerusalem, all Judea witnesses both and in and even to the remotest part of the earth." Acts then describes the movement of Jesus' Church as it grows and spreads from Jerusalem into Judea then Samaria and out from there into the world. In addition, Acts could also be describes as a play with two main characters: Peter and Paul, but that is a little more tenuous of an explanation because Acts contains lots of people who are all important to the spread of the Gospel of Jesus.

Acts has lots of fantastic powerful stories about the faith of our early Christian heroes. *Nelson's New Illustrated Bible Dictionary* puts it this way, "Acts contains portraits of many outstanding Christians of the early church. Barnabas exemplifies generosity, Stephen forgiveness, Philip and Paul obedience, Cornelius piety and the witness of the early church vibrates with boldness. Ordinary people are empowered to perform extraordinary feats. A faltering apostle is empowered to address multitudes or make a defense before rulers. A prayer fellowship is shaken; a deacon defends his faith by martyrdom. The despised Samaritans receive the Spirit, as does a Gentile soldier. A staunch persecutor of the gospel is converted and through him the gospel reaches the capital of the world!"

Finally, Acts chapter 15 describes one of the most important events in church history, especially for us as Gentiles. It is the first church council in Jerusalem. The council basically sets the standard of conduct for us as the Gentile church. There are basically two main requirements. First, we are not to follow any idols. Second, we are not to engage in sexual immorality. That hits close to home for us in the U.S., we seem to worship everything from money to politics, to entertainment and everything in between. Unfortunately, our moral practices seem to have followed our thinly veiled idolatry and have sunk to historic lows. Hopefully, we can learn from our mistakes and return to steadfast obedience to Jesus Christ the Lord and Savior.

Take a look at Acts and see the power of the Holy Spirit and the possibilities we have as a church family come to life.

May God fill your days with His wisdom and mercy!




Christian Symbol
